PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS

Please read these instructions carefully. It is important for you to follow these instructions before surgery to prevent delay or cancellations. **If you must cancel your procedure we require 48 hours notice.**

Before Your Surgery or Procedure:

A pre-operative nurse will contact you prior to your scheduled surgery. During the call, we will review your health history, medications, past surgeries, allergies, and other information about your current health status.

- Arrange for transportation before and 12 to 24 hours post surgery. Also, arrange for someone to care for you for 12 to 24 hours following surgery.
- Patients under 18 years of age must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian. Legal guardians should bring documented proof of guardianship for adults and children.
- Notify your physician if there is a change in your physical condition before your procedure, such as a cold or fever, or if you are allergic to Latex.
- Do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your procedure including food, liquids, water, gum, candy, or tobacco.
- Do not take any medication after midnight the day of your procedure unless instructed by your physician or the Surgery Center. If you are a diabetic or are taking blood pressure or heart medications, obtain specific instructions from your physician or contact the Center.

PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS

On the Day of Your Surgery/Procedure:

- Wear loose fitting comfortable clothing, and leave all jewelry, piercings, and other valuables at home.
- Bring appropriate storage cases for dentures, hearing aids, glasses, and contact lenses.
- Bring an accurate list of medications and dosages, including over the counter medicine and herbal supplements.

After Your Surgery/Procedure:

You will be given verbal and written instructions regarding your post-operative care including your doctor's orders for diet, rest, medication, and activity. It is not unusual to feel a little sleepy or dizzy for several hours after you return home. Please have a responsible adult to help you and do not sign any important papers or make significant decisions for at least 24 hours following your procedure.

If you have any questions or concerns, please call your doctor or the Lexington Clinic Ambulatory Surgery Center. A nurse will contact you the next business day after your surgery to check on your recovery.

Do not attempt to drive, operate dangerous machinery, or drink alcoholic beverages for 12 to 24 hours after your procedure.

PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS

Financial and Insurance Information

The facility fee covers the use of the Lexington Clinic Ambulatory Surgery Center, from the pre-operative phase through the procedure room and recovery phase. As a courtesy we will file your insurance if applicable.

You may be billed separately for the following services:

- Your physician or surgeon
- Your anesthesiologist
- Lab tests, EKG, radiology, and pathology for any specimens removed during the procedure
- Implants or grafts used during the procedure

Prior authorization will be obtained from your insurance company. You will be given an estimate of the amount of any deposit and/or co-insurance that is required to be collected on the day of your procedure.

You will be contacted by the Surgery Center to make arrangements for payment on the day of the procedure. If we do not reach you by phone or letter, please call us.
